New Masons Strengthen Houston Area Lodges


The Houston region is experiencing a strong wave of growth in its Masonic community as new Master Masons are distributed across the area's lodges for 2023–2025. According to the latest data, Northeast, Northcentral, and Northwest Houston districts including District 30-D leads the way with an impressive 36 new Master Masons joining lodges in Humble, Tomball, Spring, Cypress, Huffman, and Northwest. Close behind, District 28 welcomed 34 new members across lodges in Conroe, Montgomery, and North Houston.

The urban heart of the region, District 30-A—which includes key lodges in Houston, West University, and Memorial—has added 24 new Master Masons, matching the growth in District 30-H, which covers lodges in La Porte, Pasadena, and South Houston.

District 108, stretching into the suburban areas like Katy and Sugar Land, has strengthened its ranks with 19 new Masons. Smaller but steady gains were also seen in Districts 30-B, 107, 27, and 29, each adding between 10 and 13 new Master Masons.

This influx marks a healthy trend of engagement and expansion for Freemasonry in the greater Houston area, ensuring that the fraternal bonds and community service traditions continue to thrive across both urban centers and neighboring towns. The membership team continues to focus on hospital presentations at Blue Lodges, particularly in districts with high growth. May 25, 2025 Houston, TX Leah's Project- Raising Awareness Nationwide

On April 28th, a powerful milestone was reached in the life of Leah's Project. We had the incredible honor of presenting this initiative to the Imperial Potentate, First Lady Judy Burke, and the Joint Boards of Shriners International in Charleston, South Carolina.

This project began with a simple but life-saving idea: Home inspectors need to test and report water temperature to help prevent deadly scald burns-especially to children.

We launched Leah's Project in memory of a young girl named Leah, who was the Grand Daughter of Imperial Sir Richard Burke, and First Lady Judy, who tragically lost her life due to water that was simply too hot. Her story moved me deeply, and it became clear that something had to change. I own a Home Inspection Firm here in Houston. The home inspection industry had never made water temperature testing a standard—but we're working to change that.

Thanks to the support of fellow Shriners, inspection professionals, and safety advocates, Leah's Project is now becoming a national awareness and prevention movement. Inspectors across the country are adopting simple tools and processes that can alert families to dangerous water temperatures during the inspection of buying a home. We are also leaving behind "Leah's Labels, a hang tag on faucets to educate sellers on the importance of testing water temperatures. We now have 250,000 homes inspected for water Temperature and we are just starting.

During our presentation in Charleston:

- · Lady Amy Staudt shared the emotional origin of Leah's Project and how it started with a whisper at Judy's presentation last year at Imperial Session, "you need to do something about this".
- I gave an update on our national outreach, educational materials, and the wave of inspectors who are stepping up to make water temperature testing a new best practice.
- Illustrious Sir Ben LaBlanc spoke on the deeper meaning of this work—how it reflects the Shrine's century-old mission of protecting children, and "WHY" we are Shriners.
- First Lady Alyssa LaBlanc offered a heartfelt message from First Lady to First Lady, connecting the loss and love behind the project, to the impact it's having across Shrine families and leadership.

After the presentation, First Lady Judy Burke shared that "this is what I've always wanted for Leah—to spread awareness and ensure her name is never forgotten."

Richard and Judy asked that Leah's Project be presented again at the Texas Shrine Association (TSA), The Imperial First Ladies Luncheon, and the Imperial Session in Atlanta. This is a monumental step forward—not just for awareness, but for making this a lasting part of who we are as Shriners and what we stand for in our communities.




