### Looking Ahead Together: Strengthening Arabia Through Smart Stewardship

As Arabia Shriners continues to grow in both presence and potential, our leadership remains focused on making decisions that support long-term sustainability, fraternal strength, and meaningful collaboration across all areas of our organization. Recently, the Board of Directors made one such decision — one that involved a change of space within our Temple facility and one that reflects our ongoing commitment to thoughtful stewardship of our shared home.

Effective immediately, Holland Lodge No. 1, the oldest Masonic Lodge in Texas, will begin leasing what has previously been the Arabia Patrol unit room. We are proud to welcome them into our facility as partners in the Masonic family. Their presence brings not only a strong cultural and historical tie to our own mission, but also helps strengthen the financial stability of our Temple by bringing in meaningful rental income.

As part of the lease agreement, Holland Lodge will pay \$4,000 per month for exclusive use of the former Patrol unit room, in addition to \$825 per month for their continued use of the lodge room on Mondays and Wednesdays. This combined rental income will generate just under \$58,000 annually, representing nearly 27% of our total budgeted rental revenue for 2025 - a substantial and timely contribution that will help support building operations, maintenance, and mission-driven activities across the Temple.

To help support a smooth transition, the Board of Directors allocated \$4,000 to the Arabia Patrol for moving expenses and the opportunity to make the former Greeters Room their own. In a generous and selfless gesture, the Patrol respectfully declined the funds, expressing that they believed the money would be better used toward broader Shrine projects that benefit the entire Temple. Their commitment to the greater good of Arabia is a shining example of what true fraternity looks like in action.

We sincerely thank the Patrol for their flexibility, cooperation, and continued service. Their willingness to embrace change with grace and dignity demonstrates the very best of what our Nobility stands for. The move to the new space will allow the Patrol to build fresh momentum in a room that they can truly make their own—revitalizing their identity and continuing their proud legacy within Arabia Shrine.

Change often comes with challenges, but it also brings new opportunities. The addition of Holland Lodge to our building family, alongside the continued dedication of our Shrine Units like the Patrol, is proof that when we come together, great things happen. This moment marks not an end—but a new chapter of growth, collaboration, and possibility.

We also wish to clarify that while Patrol's input was appreciated and considered, the decision to lease temple space ultimately resides with the Board of Directors, per our bylaws. With that responsibility comes the duty to consider the needs of the entire organization and act in the best interest of all our Nobles.

We thank the Patrol for complying with the move-out deadline of July 28, 2025, and for doing so with professionalism and dignity. The Recorder's Office remains available to assist with any final logistics, including access to designated storage space as discussed.

This situation, while requiring change, also brings opportunity. It reflects how, when guided by respect, transparency, and shared values, our Temple can adapt and thrive. We're proud to welcome Holland Lodge to Arabia and equally proud of the Patrol's legacy of service and commitment to our Shrine family.

This moment serves as a reminder: when we work together, we all move forward.

Together, we build. Together, we serve. Together, we thrive.

#### Temple History and Museum


