
April 28th we will do our annual Fish fry for Shriners Children's Texas in Galveston for about 250 plates. Come help us serve!

Spotlight on Arabia Shriner-Brother Noble James "Jim" Bush

James Bush was born and raised in Houston, Texas. He attended Houston Vocational High School and the University of Houston. He often says "I was too lazy to work and too scared to steal, so I became a pilot". He began flying as a US Naval Aviator and then became a Captain for Continental Airlines. He later went on to become a private pilot for an oil man and eventually became part of the Flying Fezzes at Arabia.

James is widowed, with two grown children and one grandchild and enjoys reading and traveling in his free time. James joined DeMolay at 15 years old and was Raised at Reagan Lodge #1037 on July 17, 1961 and is the last living Charter member of Oak Forest Lodge #1398. James holds affiliated memberships at Holland, Temple, Doric, and Tranquility Lodges. He values the connections he has made through Masonry and is proud to belong to the world's largest fraternity.

He became a Shriner at the behest of Noble Dugan Miller on May 20, 1963 and proudly wears his **60 year pin**! He was one of the early members of the Arabia Flying Fezzes Unit, using private aircraft to transport skin and blood for surgeries at Shriners' Hospitals. For James, being a Shriner means being part of a group of men who do so much for children.

James's proudest moments include seeing happy faces during Shriner parades and being a Roustabout. His advice- "Don't let any Shriner talk you into getting into a gorilla suit and participating in a parade in July in Houston! We wore gorilla suites and rode in a cage along the parade route. We would sneak out of the cage and run along the street "scaring" the audience while the "gorilla handler" stood by seemingly oblivious. It took a lot to get us rehydrated after that parade"





Dollars and Sense from the Treasurer

Dear Nobles and Ladies,

As we continue planning exciting events and fundraisers for our Temple, it's important to stay aligned with the guidelines set forth by Shriners International—especially when it comes to referencing our beloved Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Imperial Treasurer Brad Koehn recently shared an important reminder on this topic. When promoting or advertising a fraternal fundraising event, we must **not** give the public the impression that the event is a hospital fundraiser. This includes **no hospital references in advertising materials, flyers, or tickets**. Once guests are inside the event space (such as the Temple, circus, Festival of Trees), **then and only then** may we share information about our hospitals and the life-changing care they provide.

Brad offers a helpful example from Arab Shrine's circus, where the hospital van was moved inside the arena to avoid confusion. Once patrons entered, they could be educated about our mission and impact. When the van was at the front entry it could have given the impression that it was a hospital benefit. Do feel free, if you're having a hospital benefit to advertise Shriners Children's Hospital with advertisements, patients, etc. Also, please remember if it is a hospital benefit you will need to fill out and have a CAF (charitable activity form) approved before the event.
